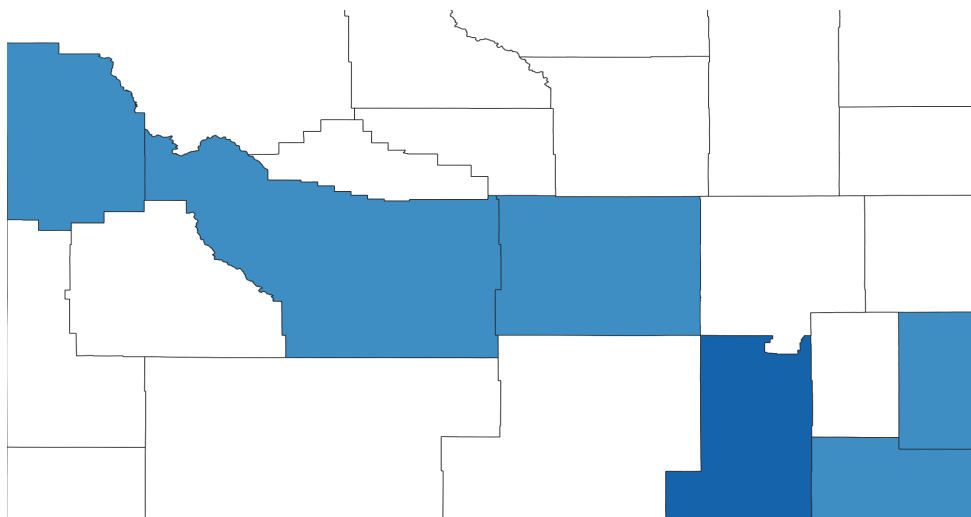

PROJECTS FINANCED IN WYOMING

Between 2003 and the second quarter of 2019, the NMTC made 6 Wyoming projects possible, including manufacturing expansions, business incubators, hospitals, vocational training centers, and daycare centers.

The following Wyoming organizations signed a letter in November of 2019 urging Congress to extend and expand the New Markets Tax Credit:
