


This project is Phase II of the Kimpton Palomar Hotel which is part of Cityscape mixed-use development located on two Downtown Phoenix city blocks by RED Development. NMTC financing will be used for energy efficiency improvements, the remodeling

of the Hotel's public areas, kitchen facilities, expand the Hotel's rooftop area into a signature full service restaurant, and build out the Hotel's wellness center.



Community Impact

Currently the Kimpton Palomar Hotel employs 150 staff and this new loan will create an additional 50 new jobs for downtown Phoenix. Due to the expansion of the food service operation, the majority will be food and beverage positions.
