New Markets Tax Credits Enable a New Beginning

Nonprofit Preschool Doubles Space and Grows Service Capacity

Fort Hayes Campus, a qualified high-distress, low-income census tract with a poverty rate of 40%.

Among the children served by The Center, 90% have been diagnosed with developmental delays related to a medical condition such as autism, cerebral palsy, Down syndrome or alcohol and drug exposure. Nearly half were born prematurely. Two-thirds of families are experiencing poverty. Without services, these children are at greatest risk of being left behind academically once they enter public or private school.

By the time they enter kindergarten, 65% of children who received services from The Center will no longer qualify for specialized services.
